Benefits:

- 10 weeks (June 5 – August 11) engaged in a research project under the direction of a laboratory scientist/engineer
- Career development workshops/lab tours
- \$500 per week stipend and limited travel reimbursement/housing allowance (for those who qualify)

To be eligible, you must:

- Be currently enrolled full-time at an accredited U.S. institution **AND** have completed at least one year as an undergraduate (at the time of application)*
- Be at least 18 years of age
- Be a U.S. Citizen or Legal Permanent Resident
- Have a minimum GPA of 3.0

Please note – the internship requires a full-time (at least 40 hours per week) commitment **onsite at ORNL in Oak Ridge, Tennessee. Some students find it reasonable to take online or evening classes during the course of the internship. Undergraduate credits obtained in high school cannot be applied to meet the minimum one-year completion requirement.*
